... **t**ouch our hearts with His love

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. [John 3:16-17 NIV]

... **t**rain our hearts as we share His story with one another

I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better. I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his people, and his incomparable great power for us who believe. [Eph. 1:17-19 NIV]

... **t**ransform our hearts to live His way in the world

And God has given us the privilege of urging everyone to come into his favor and be reconciled to him. ... This is the wonderful message He has given us to tell others. We are Christ's ambassadors. [2 Cor. 5:18b-20 LB]

It is our prayer that you will join us in our 40-day commitment to seek God's guidance and blessing. When we prepared this booklet, we made it a goal to provide material and challenges to help each of us grow spiritually throughout these next few weeks. We thought it would be

good to start by focusing on some of the words of Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount:

Enter through the narrow gate.

For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it.

But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few find it.

(Matthew 7:13-14)

Why forty days? It seems to be a time not too long that it becomes unmanageable, yet a time long enough to see something significant done. Forty days for Elijah to walk to the sacred mount when he lost his courage and, in essence, lost his faith. Forty days for Jesus to fast and be tempted as He prepared for His ministry. If God felt His Son needed those forty days to prepare for His three year ministry and trek to the cross, then we can certainly use forty days in our pursuit of spiritual maturity and growth. Are you ready to get started?

DAY #1 – Monday, November 14

Today's Challenge:

Plan a time each day to utilize this booklet. Mark it on your calendar. Put the booklet in a place that is visible. Place your Bible next to the booklet. Make a commitment to God to give your best to Him during the next 40 days. Take the first step toward a great walk with the Lord and get ready for God to bless you in amazing ways. Remember many others are joining you in this journey!

Today's Bible Reading:

Matthew 1-7

Today's Bible Verse:

"Give yourselves to God...surrender your whole being to him to be used for righteous purposes." (Romans 6:13)

Today's Prayer:

Ask God to prepare the hearts of those who will hear His Story. Pray for our Elders.

Today's Devotional:

Use the space below to journal your thoughts about this 40 day challenge. How do you feel about it? What do you hope God will do in you? How can you use the lessons from today to help you in your walk with the Lord?

DAY #2 – Tuesday, November 15

Today's Challenge:

Have you ever noticed that nobody says "TGIM!" or "TGIW!" unless you are selling caffeine products? People don't like Mondays or Wednesdays as much as Fridays. Wear a smile on your face all day. And, if you are just wrapping up your day make that your commitment for tomorrow! Plan to smile ALL day and see if it is contagious. Need a little help? Listen to some Christian music. Think positive thoughts. Surround yourself with positive people. If all else fails, call a positive person and tell them you need a pep talk!

Matthew 8-12

Today's Bible Verse:

"Now, Lord... enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness."
(Acts 4:29)

Today's Prayer:

Pray for those who will be telling God's Story. Pray for our deacons.

Today's Devotional:

Use the space below to journal your thoughts about what you think God is doing in your life right now. How is God helping you?

DAY #3 – Wednesday, November 16

Today's Challenge:

Make plans to attend worship and Bible class. Lay aside all the things you want to do and focus on what you need to do. Don't get overwhelmed with urgent things...Do the important things. There is a difference. You have a choice. Choose wisely, seek God's will, and ask God to bless your day!

Today's Bible Reading:

Matthew 13-18

Today's Bible Verse:

"Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." (Matthew 7:7)

Today's Prayer:

Ask the Lord for guidance as we seek Him. Pray for our national leaders.

Today's Devotional:

Use the space below to journal your thoughts about studying the Bible. Which Bible characters are your favorite? Why? How can you use these Bible characters as mentors in your own spiritual walk with God?

DAY #4 – Thursday, November 17

Today's Challenge:

Everyone likes a kind word of encouragement. Take some time to send someone an encouraging message (personal letter, phone call, IM, tweet, post, text, email, etc.). Say something thoughtful and positive. Then, pray God uses your words to build them up. If you are in a relationship, focus on those individuals first.

Today's Bible Reading:

Matthew 19-24

Today's Bible Verse:

"For the Word of God is living and active..." (Hebrews 4:12a)

Today's Prayer:

Praise God for speaking to us through the Bible. Pray for our ministers.

Today's Devotional:

Use the space below to journal your thoughts about the person (or people) you encouraged through today's challenge. How did they respond? Whom would you like to encourage next week? How can you plan ahead for those words of encouragement?

DAY #5 – Friday, November 18

Today's Challenge:

Everybody needs a “Good Samaritan”, right? I’m glad you agree, because today you are going to be that person! Look for an opportunity to do a good deed today. Take donuts to the office. Bake cookies for a friend. Help someone who needs a hand. Use your hands and feet to be like Jesus. Be bold and courageous. You never know how some good deed could change a person’s life forever.

Today's Bible Reading:

Matthew 25-28

Today's Bible Verses:

“It was he who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers, to prepare God’s people for works of service so that the body of Christ may be built up...” (Ephesians 4:11-12)

Today's Prayer:

Thank God for church leaders and pray for more good leaders. Pray for our state leaders.

Today's Devotional:

Use the space below to journal your thoughts about the person you helped today, or are planning on helping. What’s better than random acts of kindness? Planned acts of kindness. Who would you like to help next week?

DAY #6 – Saturday, November 19

Today's Challenge:

People who are seeking the Lord can't wait to get involved in Church related plans. Since everyone seems to be uplifted, take advantage of this opportunity to talk to people freely about how God is blessing your life. Challenge yourself to be open and honest with people about your Christian walk. God is good! All the time !

Today's Bible Reading:

Mark 1-6

Today's Bible Verse:

"Jesus said, 'If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth and the truth will set you free.'" (John 8:31-32)

Today's Prayer:

Pray that this experience will lead us to truth, freedom and hope in Christ Jesus. Pray for our local leaders.

Today's Devotional:

Use the space below to journal your thoughts about your week so far. What have you accomplished? What obstacles has Satan thrown in front of you? How is God helping you to overcome?

DAY #7 – Sunday, November 20

Today's Challenge:

We all need a day of rest and a day for fun. Make plans to spend time with your family today. If your family is far away, take this opportunity to call them and tell them about your 40 day experience. Share insight from your personal journey.... but don't forget to listen to their story.

Today's Bible Reading:

Mark 7-11

Today's Bible Verse:

"Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says."
(James 1:22)

Today's Prayer:

Confess our lack of attention to God's word. Pray for missionaries

Today's Devotional:

Use the space below to journal your thoughts about family time. What did you do? What do you hope to do? What trips/events could you plan this year to benefit your entire family? If you are away from family, what will you do as soon as you return home?

DAY #8 – Monday, November 21

Today's Challenge:

Plan your week with God on top! Put Him first. Commit to spending at least 10 minutes in prayer when you start each day this week. Find a quiet spot and talk to God. Then see if that makes a difference in your day. If you are in a relationship, or have a family, take at least one day to pray with them as well (i.e. Monday alone, Tuesday with spouse, Wednesday with a child, etc.).

Today's Prayer:

DAY #9 – Tuesday, November 22

Today's Challenge:

The Old Testament reveals that the people of God were waiting for the King to come. Jesus did come. Jesus is the Messiah! Use today as a day to give glory to the King of Kings!

Today's Bible Verse:

"One generation will commend your works to another; they will tell of your mighty acts."
(Psalm 145:4)

Today's Prayer:

Pray for our friends and family as we share God's story with them. Pray for those serving in the military.

Today's Devotional:

Use the space below to journal your thoughts about worship. What songs do you enjoy the most? What sermons have been your favorite? Whom do you sit next to and how do you encourage them to walk with the Lord?

DAY #10 – Wednesday, November 23

Today's Challenge:

The world is full of children that desperately need a mentor. Maybe you know a child that needs an encourager. Pray for them. Then, make some time to do something about it. Be a volunteer for their activities. Have them over to the house for dinner. Take them out for an activity. Be creative and make a difference. Try to encourage them with both your words and your actions.

Today's Bible Reading:

Luke 5-9

Today's Bible Verse:

"Jesus said, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these.'" (Matthew 19:14)

Today's Prayer:

Ask God to bless our children as they learn of His love for them. Pray for the weak.

Today's Devotional:

Use the space below to journal your thoughts about children in today's society. How have things changed? What can you do to make a difference with the youth of our culture? What good things have you noticed, especially with our young people in the church family?

DAY #11 – Thursday, November 24

Today's Challenge:

No matter what your age, your work is not done. You still have enough time to do some important things. Make plans to give God all you got! Bring your Bible with you when you go out. And bring a Christ-like spirit! It's going to be a GREAT day!

Today's Bible Reading:

Luke 10-13

Today's Bible Verse:

"Glorify the Lord with me; let us exalt his name together." (**Psalm 34:3**)

Today's Prayer:

Thank the Lord that His written word is so accessible to us. Pray for grandmothers.

Today's Devotional:

We are more than ¼ through the 40 days. Take this opportunity to reflect on what it has meant to you to have daily devotions, readings, prayers, and prayer targets. What have you enjoyed the most about this booklet? What would you change?

DAY #12 – *Friday, November 25*

Today's Challenge:

Today is a day to love your enemies. Do you have someone that has wronged you? Would you challenge yourself to pray for them? Talk to them.

Today's Bible Reading:

Luke 14-19

Today's Bible Verse:

"Show me your ways, O Lord, teach me your paths; guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my savior, and my hope is in you all day long." (Psalm 25:4)

Today's Prayer:

Pray that we will be challenged by each week's message. Pray for cancer patients.

Today's Devotional:

Use the space below to journal your thoughts about the way God has led you to where you are now. What hurdles have you overcome? How has God walked with you? If you could summarize your story in five sentences, what would you say?

DAY #13 – *Saturday, November 26*

Today's Challenge:

No matter your plans today, challenge yourself to pause every few moments today to say "Praise the Lord." Because God is good and He deserves to hear you say it. Add it to your vocabulary. You never know, it might stick!

Today's Bible Reading:

Luke 20-24

Today's Bible Verse:

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16)

Today's Prayer:

Praise God for Jesus Christ, the ultimate expression of His love. Pray for prisoners.

Today's Devotional:

Yesterday we considered how good God has been to us and journaled our thoughts about Him. Now, take some time to describe how God has used other people to touch your life (at least three people). Consider how these people have blessed you throughout your Christian journey.

DAY #14 – Sunday, November 27

Today's Challenge:

Don't wait to get yourself in a "worship" frame of mind. Before you get up today, or before you pillow your head tonight, try doing these things: praise God for His greatness and consider the death of Jesus on the cross. Praise the Lord for this day! This is His day!

Today's Bible Reading:

John 1-5

Today's Bible Verse:

"If any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to him." (**James 1:5**)

Today's Prayer:

Ask God for wisdom as we apply His story to our own life story. Pray for prison ministry.

Today's Devotional:

How "wise" do you feel? How do you use your words to inspire or encourage? Jesus was called "The Word of God" or the "mouthpiece" of God. Use the space below to journal your thoughts about how you can change your thoughts and words to be the mouth of God to others.

DAY #15 – Monday, November 28

Today's Challenge:

Today belongs to the Lord! Prepare to be a blessing to others. Think about Jesus' ministry. No one ever did ministry like Jesus. He was a trail blazer. That means He did things that no one ever did before Him. He touched the leper. He held the children. He spoke to Samaritan women. He embraced Gentiles. He was a rabbi that visited the sick. What an example!

Today's Bible Reading:

John 6-9

Today's Bible Verse:

"We proclaim him, admonishing and teaching everyone with all wisdom, so that we may present everyone perfect in Christ. To this end I labor, struggling with all his energy, which so powerfully works in me." (**Colossians 1:28-29**)

Today's Prayer:

Thank God for those who prepared the materials for our study. Pray for orphans.

Today's Devotional:

Use the space below to journal your thoughts about serving God. What could you do to improve your daily walk?

DAY #16 – *Tuesday, November 29*

Today's Challenge:

When you look at look at your life what do you see? This is a good day to consider who am I, what are my goals in life, Who is my master? Am I a leader. Try to find a way to be a leader today. Get involved. Volunteer to go first. Take on the extra project. Ignore the critics. Stand tall. And let God use you to accomplish great things.

Today's Bible Reading:

John 10-15

Today's Bible Verse:

"But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all truth." **(John 16:13)**

Today's Prayer:

Praise God for His Holy Spirit who guides us. Pray for new mothers.

Today's Devotional:

Think of a great leader that inspired you. It can be a parent, teacher, or just a public speaker. What impressed you the most about them? How did they inspire you?

DAY #17 – Wednesday, November 30

Today's Challenge:

I wonder how people are responding to your kind words of encouragement? Take some time to send someone an encouraging message (call, IM, tweet, post, text, email, etc.). Make sure it is someone different than before. Be selective. Be purposeful. Say something thoughtful and positive. Try using Scripture. Then, pray God uses your words to build them up.

Today's Bible Reading:

John 16-21

Today's Bible Verse:

"These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up." (**Deuteronomy 6:6-7**)

Today's Prayer:

Pray for our families as they experience God's love together. Pray for babies.

Today's Devotional:

For your devotional time today make a list of people who have encouraged you over the past year. It could be a teacher, mentor, parent, or friend. Who are they (list at least 5)? Hopefully you have sent them a word of encouragement and expressed your appreciation for them. Now, take this time to praise God for them. Spend some time in prayer praying that God will bless them as much as they have blessed you.

DAY #18 – Thursday, December 1

Today's Challenge:

Challenge yourself to see past the ordinary today. Jesus could look into the heart of a person. He saw the good inside people. Try to see people like that today. Ignore their flaws. Choose to see goodness. And then be positive around them!

Today's Bible Reading:

Acts 1-4

Today's Bible Verse:

"Flee the evil desires of youth, and pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace, along with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart." (II Timothy 2:22)

Today's Prayer:

Pray for conviction of sin in our lives and the willingness to repent. Pray for the lame.

Today's Devotional:

Use the space below to journal your thoughts about last night's study. How did the world see Jesus? How do you see Jesus? How can others see Jesus in you?

DAY #19 – Friday, December 2

Today's Challenge:

The Lord is working in you. You may not see it, but if you are a Christian, it is true! God has placed His Holy Spirit in you. You should live with purpose. With passion. With zeal. Today could be a “me” day. Take one. You deserve it. Focus on what God’s spirit is urging you to do. Take an early lunch. Find a quiet place. Do something David did. Meditate. Think about God’s purpose for your life. He is writing your story! Do you think others would want to read it? Allow God to take the pen. Surrender to His will.

Today's Bible Reading:

Acts 5-9

Today's Bible Verse:

“...for it is God who works in you to will and to act according to his good purpose.”
(Philippians 2:13)

Today's Prayer:

Ask God to make our hearts receptive to His story and protect our minds from distractions. Pray for the blind.

Today's Devotional:

Use the space below to add more people to your personal prayer list. Consider those who are sick and shut-in. How can God help them? What specific needs could you lift up?

Journal:

DAY #20 – Saturday, December 3

Today's Challenge:

This day marks the half-way point in our 40 days together. As a collective body we have commended this time to devotion and spiritual renewal. Since it is a congregational challenge, we urge you today to spend some time with someone else engaged in this study. Personal visits would be great, but if time does not permit, calling or messaging would suffice. Encourage each other to keep on keeping on! Discuss how you are both growing through this experience.

Today's Bible Reading:

Acts 10-15

Today's Bible Verse:

"And God has given us the privilege of urging everyone to come into his favor and be reconciled to him... This is the wonderful message He has given us to tell others. We are Christ's ambassadors." (II Corinthians 5: 18b-20)

Today's Prayer:

Ask God to be our voice as we boldly share our testimony with those who need Jesus. Pray for the poor.

Today's Devotional:

Use the space below to journal your thoughts about God's vision for the church family. What do you see God doing? What do you think He has planned for us?

DAY #21 – Sunday, December 4

Today's Challenge:

Consider this to be a resurrection day! The death of Jesus is the saddest part God's story. But what comes next? The resurrection! The happiest part! Make today a happy day! Choose to be happy, happy, happy! Send a message to 10 people today reminding them that God is good or that God loves them. Lift some spirits today!

Today's Bible Reading:

Acts 16-21

Today's Bible Verse:

"Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind." (**Romans 12:2a**)

Today's Prayer:

Pray that each of us will have a renewed desire to pursue spiritual habits in their lives. Pray for our nurses.

Today's Devotional:

Use the space below to journal your thoughts about tonight's study. What insights did you take away from our time together? What does the resurrection of Jesus mean to you? Have you been raised up with Jesus in baptism? Will you raise up with Jesus on the last day?

DAY #22 – Monday, December 5

Today's Challenge:

Ever watched a butterfly emerge from a cocoon? Google it. It is an amazing sight. What's more amazing is what you don't see. The transformation on the inside. Take an opportunity today to share your story with someone. Tell them how God is changing you from the inside out. If you are into social media, use a tweet, a post, or a group message to let others know how much God means to you

Today's Bible Reading:

Acts 22-28

Today's Bible Verse:

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled."
(Matthew 5:6)

Today's Prayer:

Pray that our church would hunger and thirst for spiritual transformation. Pray for our new members.

Today's Devotional:

God is not finished with you yet. You will shed your cocoon when you leave this world. Use the space below to journal what you would like to change right now in your life. What things would you like to give up? Are you willing to give them to God?

Journal:

DAY #23 – Tuesday, December 6

Today's Challenge:

Another crazy day, eh? That seems nearly impossible for those grounded in Christ. Because we know that God is with us! When you see someone stressing out, go to them, and then pray for them. Better yet, pray with them! Pause and ask God to be with them. Maybe they will come to know the peace that you have in Christ. It might open more doors in the future.

Today's Bible Reading:

Romans 1-6

Today's Bible Verse:

"...I pray that you may enjoy good health and that all may go well with you..." (II John 3)

Today's Prayer:

Pray for physical protection and good health for our leaders and congregation. Pray for teens.

Today's Devotional:

Use the space below to journal about those who are experiencing grief and sorrow at this time. It may be their hour of darkness. How is their loss affecting their personal walk with God? What can you do to help?

DAY #24 – Wednesday, December 7

Today's Challenge:

The Bible has a lot to say about widows. God takes ministry to the widows seriously. In Romans 12 we can see that each of us have a talent. What is yours? Maybe it is encouraging those who are alone. Take some time to visit or call a widow. Check in on a lonely neighbor. Let God use you to be a blessing to someone who needs a word of love or an act of kindness.

Today's Bible Reading:

Romans 7-12

Today's Bible Verse:

"Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with him and he with me." (**Revelation 3:20**)

Today's Prayer:

Pray that each person would sense God's presence in their personal studies. Pray for children.

Today's Devotional:

From time to time we need to do a spiritual inventory. Use the space below to list five of your spiritual gifts. Where are your talents? On the opposite side of that list...write ways that you can use those talents to the glory of the Lord. Consider a ministry or mission where you can use that talent and then take action.

DAY #25 – Thursday, December 8

Today's Challenge:

Today is a day for cold water. What does that mean? Today should feel like a day of service. Consider your environment today. Work, school, or shopping? Seek out someone who needs a blessing. Do they need a helping hand? Hold open the door. Give up your parking spot. Be a servant. Invite them to our next Church service. It might change the way they view the world.

Today's Bible Reading:

Romans 12-16

Today's Bible Verse:

"And if anyone gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones because he is my disciple, I tell you the truth, he will certainly not lose his reward." (**Matthew 10:42**)

Today's Prayer:

Pray that God's blessings would be poured out on those who lead and serve. Pray for our neighbors.

Today's Devotional:

After 25 days in this spiritual walk you have probably experienced some hurdles. Missing opportunities, skipping devotionals, sleeping through Bible class, or judging others. Why does this happen? Satan hates it when we choose to commit our time and work to the Lord. He especially hates it when God takes up all our time. Use the space below to journal your thoughts about why Satan hates the church and how he uses people and circumstances to frustrate us. Determine NOT to let Satan have control of your time. What can you do to stay grounded and faithful?

DAY #26 – Friday, December 9

Today's Challenge:

Our words are powerful. They take root into the hearts of others. We are encouraged in the Bible to season our words with grace and speak the truth in love. Determine today that you will say NOTHING more than what love will allow. If you find that Difficult consider how difficult it might be to take a vow of silence! Say positive, uplifting things today to all those around you.

Pray for God's power to touch each person's heart to respond to him with praise. Pray for law enforcement.

Why does God deserve praise? Use the space below to journal your thoughts about the awesomeness of God. Use words to describe His nature. Then, use those words in a prayer to Him.

DAY #27 – Saturday, December 10

Today's Challenge:

How are things with your family? It would be a great day to spend quality time with your family. Plan a short trip. There are plenty of places to go and things to do in our community. Go out to eat. Go for a walk (bundle up). Play a board game together. Make it a day to remember, but don't leave God out of it. Give Him the glory!

Today's Bible Reading:

I Corinthians 9-16

Today's Bible Verse:

"How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God!" (I John 3:1)

Today's Prayer:

Praise God for the abundant grace He has poured out upon His people. Pray for the lost.

Today's Devotional:

Where did you go today? What did you do? If you didn't take advantage of this time with family, why not? What can you plan for another day? Use the space below to journal your thoughts about the need for quality family time.

Today's Challenge:

How high have you been? Have you climbed a mountain? Flown high into the heavens? Rarely do we remember the deepest we have been. Unless you are into diving, it's just not something we consider often. God wants us to dive deep with Him. May God bless our day!
